




Both synchronized and solo dances were performed, highlighting the artistic beauty of traditional Chinese dance. All of the performers the Youth Journalists interviewed said that they really enjoy performing, and everyone in the audience was entertained during the performance! Producer Wang Xinge, director Xu Yi, and stage directors Huang Yan and Zhen Lijie are a few of the many contributors that made this show possible.

At this hearing, three YAP members—Mabelle Liu, Joe Li, and Mark Li—along with supportive parents actively shared their perspectives on issues important to our community. The event, which lasted until 10:30 PM, attracted a large audience, with mandatory school holidays as a key focus. Students from other communities, including Indian and Pakistani Muslim groups, also voiced their concerns. They're followed with a powerful and eloquent testimony by Howard County Chinese School board chairperson Ning Li, whose words left a strong impression on everyone present.

We are incredibly proud of our YAP members for their impactful participation. Thank you for representing the Chinese-American community with such skill and passion. Together, we continue to advocate for meaningful change!



Maryland STEM Festival Co-Hosted by HCCS at Howard Community College

Whir, buzz, clank! On Nov 17, 2024, the Maryland State STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) Festival was held at Howard Community College (HCC). The eight Howard County Chinese School (HCCS) robotics teams co-hosted this event, as well as the health, science, and technology departments of the HCC. One of the main purposes of this gathering was to inspire young students to explore or to keep exploring STEM.

Our HCCS groups that attended include the following First Tech Challenge (FTC) teams: the Howard Dynamics robotics team, AlphaBots, and Ingenuity, and the following First LEGO League (FLL) teams: the Advanced Robotics Team (ART), No Limits, and Buster Botz. Many groups outside of HCCS also attended, such as teams from Maryland high schools and a few Maryland engineering firms.

Overall, this was a great experience for the people who came! In the Science, Engineering, and Technology (SET) building, where FTC robotics team exhibits were displayed, as well as in the Duncan Hall (DH) building, where FLL robotics team exhibits were displayed, students and adults of all ages displayed engineering projects at their different exhibits. During the event, our HCCS FLL teams showed off the mechanical LEGO robots that they built. Students from a Carroll County robotics team put on an impressive performance, showing off their robot that could shoot ten-inch rings high

into the air. Additionally, engineering majors from the University of Maryland talked about their majors to any students who passed by their exhibit, helping inspire young future engineers and promoting the art of engineering.

When the HCCS Youth Journalists interviewed the students at the festival, the robotics students not only talked about STEM competition-related experiences but also talked a little about inclusivity and community outreach. A Howard Dynamics team member, Zara, shared that their team's goals were to do well in challenges while also inspiring other students to join the STEM program. A CRYPTIC member, James, also told the Youth Journalists that one of their team's focuses is on extending their outreach to underrepresented communities in STEM, such as females.

Finally, the highlight of the afternoon was the closing ceremony. Dr Ming Li, the HCCS principal, said a few words regarding the festival, thanking HCC for supporting and helping HCCS "nurture young minds and empower the next generation of STEM leaders." This was followed up by another speech, the speaker being experienced astronaut Donald Thomas. Everyone was super excited by the arrival of this legend. In his presentation, Thomas described his journey from his first time watching a space shuttle take off at six to being selected as a NASA astronaut. He said, "It takes time, it takes hard work, it takes persistence, but you can accomplish anything you want to in your lifetime."

It is safe to say that the purpose of the STEM festival was successfully fulfilled. Everyone in the HCC buildings at the time could enjoy and appreciate the art of robotics and engineering, STEM person or not. We will very much look forward to next year's STEM festival!

云南之旅

我叫 Sumayyah Ali,中文名叫艾淑美。我出生在美国,但我的爸爸妈妈是巴基斯坦人。我开始学中文的时候大概两岁,我非常喜欢中文。爸爸几乎每年暑假都会带我去中国旅游,今年是我第五次去中国。

我去过中国的北京、上海、河南、四川、银川。其中银川这个城市是我们住留最多的。因为我们是回民,所以在银川吃清真食品比较容易,最重要的是,我也有几位朋友住在银川。

今年暑假,我的中文老师建议我们去游览其他的地方。中国的历史文化悠久且多元化,每一个地方都有自己的独特风格。听了老师的建议,我和爸爸去了一趟云南。在旅行团的带领下,我和爸爸游览了昆明、大理、丽江。

我们第一站落地昆明。飞机降落的时候,我发现云南土地颜色和其他城市土地颜色不一样。后来,我在网上查到,云南的红土地特别有名,适合种植花草。我们在炎热的夏天来到昆明,但是出机场时,昆明没有像其他城市那么炎热,气温特别舒服。因为云南气温舒服,土壤又肥沃,所以花特别美。我在昆明找到了十种我从来没有见过的花:夜来香、乒乓菊花、天鹅绒、桔梗、蓝星、羽毛球、四方豆、水明豆、火焰、小黄瓜。其中我最喜欢的是蓝星,平时我们见到的花通常都是红、粉、或绿的。但是蓝星是蓝色的,很少见,所以特别美。

我和爸爸一起去吃了云南非常有名的过桥米 线和汽锅鸡。过桥米线会有许多小碟子,每个小 碟子里面是各种各样的菜和肉,需要自己放到热 滚滚的汤锅里面,米线清淡爽口,我特别喜欢。 当听到汽锅鸡这个名字,觉得汽锅鸡会是一个很 大的锅,结果上菜之后发现是每人一个小小的 锅。锅的中间有一个出气口,锅里面只有鸡和 汤。虽然很好吃,但是骨头比较多。 云南的茶很有名,尤其是普洱茶。我们在云 南吃饭期间,基本每顿饭都有搭配热茶。每次吃 完饭,喝一杯普洱茶,感觉胃里特别温暖。

吃饱喝足后,导游带着我们一起去石林。石林并不在昆明,离昆明30分钟的车程。 石林的石头都是自然形成的。石林比较有名的是阿诗玛石像。这个石头还有一个传说。传说中的阿诗玛是彝族撒尼人。据说,阿诗玛被水滚进去的时候,成了石崖,变成了回声神。

石林里的景点,我最喜欢的是莲花池。当时我一听要去莲花池,就非常开心,因为我很喜欢莲花。结果一看,池里一个莲花也没有。后来导游给我解释了一下,莲花池一年四季一个莲花也没有,只是有一个像莲花一样的石头在池旁边。逛完石林,我们结束了今天的旅程,前往大理。

我们的下一站是大理白族自治区。在大理的第一天,我们去了洱海和花海。大理大多数的景点都是沿着洱海的。我们骑着吉普车去看花海。花海可漂亮了,有各种各样的花,还有山。我们还租了自行车沿着洱海的小道骑,微风吹过来,感觉特别舒服。我们还去了双廊古镇和理想邦。双廊古镇和理想邦也是沿着洱海的,两个都是购物区,里面的东西各种各样,林良满目。双廊古镇街景比较美,可以走到洱海的岸边。我在双廊古城吃了云南的另一特色鲜花饼,味道美极了。
